- 3. Read Acts 9:1-2.
 - a. What does this passage say about the character of Saul?
 - b. Who are those followers of "The Way?"
 - c. Do you have any people in your life that are full of hate?
 - d. Do you know anyone who blasts others on social media?
- 4. According to Acts 9:3-5, what came down from heaven?
 - a. Who asked the question in verse four?
 - b. What does verse four say about the relationship between Jesus and His church and christians?
 - c. Have you ever considered, when you hurt the church, you hurt Jesus?
 - d. When you help the church, you help Jesus. Does this change your view of the church? Does it change your commitment to the church? Talk about it!
- 5. Read Acts 9:6-9.
 - a. Who heard the voice?
 - b. What do you think Saul was thinking about during these three days?
 - c. God cut Saul off from the physical world so that he could understand the spiritual world. Sometimes to understand spiritual truth, you need to separate yourself from this world. Is there something that you need to cut out of your life to hear God's voice more clearly and understand His will?

 - a. Who will Saul be preaching to?

- c. Are there times when Christians suffer?
- d. How is this different from our consumer mentality?
- e. What do you typically do when you face suffering?
- 8. According to Acts 9:17, what did Ananias do?
 - a. What happened to Saul?
 - b. Who filled Saul?
 - c. According to Acts 9:18, what fell from Saul's eyes?
 - d. What did these scales represent? Was it literal or figurative?
 - e. What happened next? Based on Acts 9:19, what did Saul do?
