Warming up

1. What does Hosanna mean to you? What memories come to your mind when you hear the word, Hosanna?

Digging Deeper & Application

Take your time reading the scripture given. If possible look up the verses in different versions and pause at each verse and discuss it.

- 2. ReadRead Mark 11:1-11. Compare Mark's account of the entry to the other gospels (Matthew 21:1-11, Luke 19:28-44, John 12:12-19). What differences or similarities stick out to you?
- 3. Pastor Jeremy shared about the history of the Israelites up to Jesus' time. What were the people of Jerusalem expecting as Jesus entered? Why did they raise palms and shout Hosanna? What was really on Jesus' mind as he entered Jerusalem?
- 4. Read Psalm 118. What sticks out to you in this psalm? What verses were the people of Jerusalem quoting as Jesus arrived?
- 5. Read Psalm 24:7-10. Who is the King of Glory that the psalmist wrote about?

- 6. What does Jesus' entry on Palm Sunday mean to you?
- 7. Read Romans 12:1. What does Paul say worship looks like? What does your worship of Jesus look like?

Application

Below are some of the points or quotes shared in the message. Discuss how they apply to your life.

- The crowds expected a new earthly king of Israel that would save them from the oppression of Roman rule, not that of Jesus who came to suffer and save them from their sin
- God wants us to walk in obedience to him.
- God went before the disciples as they walked in obedience.
- When you see the the cross, the torture, the whipping, the pain, the sacrifice he's made for you, you shouldn't be able to hold in your praise for him.
