Warming up

Digging Deeper & Application

2. How often do you read the bible? What plan do you use? Is there a place you enjoy reading the bible?
3. How many verses are in Psalm 119?
 - a. How many Hebrew alphabets are in Psalm 119?
 - b. How many verses are under each Hebrew alphabet?
4. Please read the first section, Psalm 119:1-8. What is the main message of this passage?
5. Do you have a favorite verse or passage in Psalm 119? Why is it special to you?
6. Please read Psalm 119:9-11, 37, 59, 67, 68, 71, 76, 105, 133, 141, 148, 160, 161, 165, and 176.

What do these verses say about the value and power of God's word?

7. According to Luke 8:15, what does a "good-hearted" person do with God's word?

8. How did Elijah hear God's word in 1 Kings 19:11-12?

9. According to these verses, what is the purpose of God's word?
 - a. Hebrews 4:12
 - b. Matthew 4:4
 - c. 2 Timothy 3:16-17

10. What do these verses say about God's word and Jesus? John 1:1, and Revelation 19:12-13.
